CESC organises an exhibition on 'Observing Intensified Diarrhoea Control Fortnight (ICDF) Week' in Kamarhati Municipality

An exhibition cum awareness programme on causes, prevention and care of diarrhoea was organised from 11th July to 19th July, 2019 under Suswasthya Project in collaboration with Kamarhati Health Department.

The exhibition was organised at the Urban Primary Health Centre (UPHC) 1, Kamarhati Municipality and was inaugurated by Dr. Abhishek Dutta, full-time Medical Officer, UPHC 1 and Ms. Champa Banerjee, Second Tier Supervisor, UPHC1.



The programme was open for all community members which saw a footfall of approximately 450. Various officers from the Health Department also visited the programme.

Debanjan Sen Football Tournament

Apart from a tableau, walkers carried banners and posters disseminating messages on prevention of hepatitis. The walk commenced from the north gate of Victoria Memorial and culminated at Nandan Film Centre.

Inauguration of toilets and water stations in schools under Nirmal Abhiyan

Nirmal Abhiyan is a WASH in schools Project undertaken in 23 government schools in Kolkata. The Project was implemented in four schools during the year 2018-19. The inaugural programme of the sanitation and drinking water facilities for two schools Garfa Shibtala Free Primary School and Rajnarayan Junior Basic School was held on 18th July, 2019. Two other schools namely Rajapur Shikha Bithi and Gayaram Sishu Shiksha Niketan was inaugurated on 25th July, 2019. The sanitation and drinking water facilities include separate toilet units for boys and girls, child-friendly hand washing stations and water purifiers. The Project also undertakes general renovation work in the schools ensuring that the schools' environment is transformed completely making it a better place to impart education.

Roshni and Suswasthya Projects observe Breast Feeding Week

As part of the Breastfeeding Week observation, sensitisation programmes on exclusive breastfeeding and breastfeeding techniques were conducted between 1st and 7th August, 2019 under the Roshni Project implemented in Tiljala and Suswasthya Project implemented in Kamarhati Municipality.



The objectives of the programmes were to sensitize pregnant women, lactating mothers and other caregivers of children regarding breastfeeding practices, importance and the process of breastfeeding. Among those who participated in these programmes were pregnant women, lactating mothers, other caregivers of children, Medical Officers from the Health Department, ICDS supervisors and Anganwadi Workers. disseminated to the Information was beneficiaries through expert talks, visuals and interactive sessions. Quizzes were also conducted to assess beneficiary understanding. In all approximately 470 beneficiaries participated in the programmes.

Bal Urja Diwas celebrated under Urja Chetana Project

The Annual Bal Urja Chetana Diwas under the Urja Chetana Project, a CSR initiative of CESC, was celebrated on 28th August, 2019, at CESC Recreation Centre. 200 students and 18 teachers from 21 schools attended the felicitation event and participated in a cultural programme.

Urja Chetana is a project focused on promoting 'Education for Sustainable Development' in schools. Since its inception in 2012, a network of 45 schools have been formed and 60,000 students have been involved through the Project.

An exhibition on 'Best of Waste' products, and working models and posters on 'Save Environment' and 'Save Water' were put on display by students of the participating schools. Schools and teacher in-charges were felicitated during the event for participating in various activities organised under Urja Chetana Project. Student prizes for various competitions and contests around environmental themes, organised in the participating schools throughout the year, were also handed over to the winners.

20-year-old **Md. Nadim Jawed**, from Kamarhati Municipality, completed his Higher Secondary examination in 2015, after which he was unable to get a decent job. Hailing from a financially weak family, he joined the Basic Computer course at Prayas, Kamarhati Centre, with the hope of getting a job. After successfully completing training, he got the job of a Collection Executive with Bajaj Capital, Park Street, and is earning a monthly salary of Rs.11,000.

Zarina (name changed), aged 12, lives with her parents and siblings. Her father, a security guard earns a sum of Rs. 5000/per month. Though she was a bright child and was keen on studying further, she had no choice but to drop-out of school due to high education costs. She then joined her mother and siblings in cutting straps for slippers so as to earn an additional income for the family. She was identified as a drop-out child when the volunteers of Hamari Awaaz Project were conducting their home visits. Zarina then expressed her wish to study and complete her education. Her desire to pursue her studies finally came true when she was enrolled and mainstreamed into formal education once again. Since then, Zarina has been attending school regularly and is doing well in her academics. She and her family are active supporters of the Hamari Awaaz Project.
