Maulana Hasrat Mohani Memorial Girls High School has been a part of Urja Chetana Programme since 2013 and has been contributing actively to environment conservation with a combined team of passionate students and teachers. activities include composting, waste paper recycling, development of vertical garden in recycled plastic pet bottles, apart from energy and waste audits. The school has been able to compost 11 kgs of organic waste and recycle 5.35 kgs of waste paper last year. They have harvested 144 plants in their vertical garden. The school has also undertaken clean-up campaigns in its neighbouring areas.
