## **Bio-Toilets Installed in Chetla Lock Gate**

Under CESC's CSR initiative, **27 Aerobic Bio-Toilets** and **6 Ladies' Washrooms** have been successfully installed in the Chetla Lock Gate slum to **enable safe sanitation** for the slum-dwellers. The initiative has benefited 1500 slum-dwellers. Apart from the installation, behaviour change training has also been imparted to the beneficiaries.

### **Training of Police Personnel on Basic Computer**

CESC in partnership with CLPOA conducted a training on Basic Computer for Police Personnel under the Barrackpore Police Commissionerate with the objective of **improving their basic knowledge in computer application**. The training commenced from 7<sup>th</sup> December, 2020 with **114** (Male-74 and Female - 40) police personnel from various police stations under Barrackpore Police Commissionerate. The training was completed on 6<sup>th</sup> January, 2021.

A Felicitation programme was organised on 29<sup>th</sup> January, 2021 which was inaugurated by Mr. Manoj Kumar Verma, IPS, Hon'ble Commissioner of Police, Barrackpore Police Commissionerate. **100 trainees got certificates** on the basis of gradation from the assessments conducted. The top 13 (who got 85% and above) and the next 19 highest scorers (whose scores ranged from 75% to 84%) received cash award prizes from Barrackpore Police Commissionerate for their outstanding achievement.

#### **Nutrition Mela under Suswasthya Project**

A two-day **Nutrition Mela** was organised under the Suswasthya Project on 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> February, 2021 in Kamarhati Municipality. Keeping in mind all safety protocols of COVID-19, this year the mela was organized in four locations in Ward No. 11 and 16. The objective of this programme was to **spread knowledge among beneficiaries on proper growth and development of children**; provide proper information on health and hygiene of adolescents; reduce morbidity, mortality and malnutrition and **establish improved health status** and to build the capacity of mothers on the health and nutritional need of the child, adolescent and of themselves.

The mela was inaugurated by Mr. Gopal Saha, Hon'ble Chairperson, Kamarhati Municipality along with Dr. Neepa Saha Sharma, Head-CSR, CESC Limited and Mrs. Nandini Chatterjee, Secretary, CLPOA. **410 mothers** with their children and **155 adolescents** attended the mela for two days. A special felicitation programme was organized to honour the dedication and hard work of the active Mahila Samity members and Adolescent Peer Group members from project field area.

# Story of Change

Rita Chakraborty, a 50 year old resident of Chetla slum, works as a maid. She was very unhappy with the sanitation facilities they previously had. She said that most of the time the toilets remained dirty and had foul odour. There was no one to clean the toilets. As part of the CESC's CST initiative, bio-toilets were installed in the Chetla slum. After the installation of these bio-toilets, Rita is now happy and proud to use a toilet, which is covered and eco-friendly. Previously they had to stand in queue to use toilets and sometimes had to defecate in open, otherwise they would get late for work. Now they do not have to defecate in the open. The toilets, which have been placed strategically, have earmarked households who would use them. Hence, they do not have to wait in queues like before and thus, can go to work on time.
