Capacity building training on academic and teaching methodology for teachers of Special Guidance centres

Under the Nayee Roshni Project, a **five-day capacity building training programme** was held for teachers and project staff of the special guidance centres project based on academic aspects. Based on findings from the Training Need Assessment, the training module was developed on language, Mathematics and facilitation skills for teachers. To minimize fear from students on English language and Mathematics, teachers were capacitated on easy and scientific methods in context of listening, speaking, reading, writing, vocabulary development, knowledge of grammar & comprehensive mind mapping technique of children.

Teachers Training under Nirmal Abhiyan Project

A **teachers training** was conducted on **12th March, 2022** in Muslim UP School along with representatives from SPS UP Hindi School and Prafullanagar Prathamik Vidyalaya. The training was conducted to **create awareness** among school teachers on the **issues concerning water, sanitation and hygiene**, to keep the teachers aware about the reduction of incidence of water and sanitation related diseases among school children and increase the attendance in school and to ensure future sustainability of the hardware facilities provided to the schools under the Nirmal Abhiyan School Wash Project.

Training with adolescents on SRH issues under Hamari Awaaz Child Protection Project

Peer Leaders, formed under the Hamari Awaaz Child Protection Project, **conducted sessions with 133 adolescents focusing on the transitional aspect of adolescence**, that is, from conventional parent-controlled health seeking behaviour to self-aware health seeking behaviour. The discussion started with changes in body and mind that they and the participants witnessed in themselves. The scientific reasons of those changes, process of menstruation cycle and importance of healthy diet during menstruation were explained. Participants were informed that with the support of project team they can avail Sexual Reproductive Health (SRH) related services from the government health facilities.

Ms Sumita Saha, Public Health Nurse (PHN) conducted the training through interactive sessions to discuss issues such as child immunisation, nutrition, adolescent health management, family planning and measures to stop teenage pregnancy.

Placement under Skill Development Projects

As part of its CSR initiatives, CESC runs several skill development centres in Topsia-Tiljala, Khidderpore, Garden Reach and Howrah. Recently 20 girls who had attended our tailoring course got employed with HP Cotton Casuals Private Limited with a salary of Rs.7,150 per month. This is a huge step in social and economic empowerment of girls, who were earlier hesitant to take up employment in any factory establishment and would prefer self-employment.

Saddam was not interested in studies and had dropped out of school after class X and would waste his time indulging in gossips with friends from the locality. But when his father's business took a hit and he and his family started to face a financial crunch, Saddam was desperate for a job. Through the mike campaigning conducted by the Prayas Project staff, he came to know about the centre and approached it to enroll himself for driving. He took the classes seriously and on successful completion of his driving course, he received his driving licence. He now drives a chotta haathi and earns Rs.9,000/- a month. He is now happy as he too can contribute to his family's income.
