On October 16, 2023, World Handwashing Day was commemorated in Kamarhati Municipality as part of the Indradhanush Project. The primary aim of this initiative was to raise awareness among children regarding the significance of hand washing and to educate them on the proper steps involved. 420 children were briefed on the importance of hand hygiene, understanding that neglecting to wash hands adequately can lead to illness by transmitting germs or viruses to the body. Additionally, participants were enlightened about the pivotal role handwashing plays as the foremost method of disease prevention.

Maa-o-Shishu Mela Organised under SNEH Project

Eye Camp organised in Pujali, Budge Budge

An eye camp was organised at Pujali Shikshaniketan School on 16th December, 2023 under the CSR initiatives of CESC Limited to create accessibility of eye care services within the targeted community. A total of 274 community members registered themselves for the free eye camp, undergoing vision tests. Among the 274 beneficiaries, 193 had vision problems and were provided free spectacles. 48 patients needed cataract surgery operation and were referred to Calcutta Lions Bimal Poddar Eye Hospital.

<u>Students of Eklavya - CESC Skill Academy Centres in</u> <u>Topsia and Tiljala Felicitated</u>

A Felicitation Programme for the students of Eklavya – CESC Skill Academy Centres in Topsia and Tiljala was held on November 28, 2023. 300 youths from these two centres were trained in Basic Computer with Advanced Excel, Tailoring, Beauty and Wellness, and Retail trades in 2022-23. The event was graced by Jb. Javed Ahmed Khan, the Hon'ble Minister-in-Charge of Disaster Management, Government of West Bengal, Mr. Anirban Raha, GM (Planning), Dr. Neepa Saha Sharmaa, (Head-CSR), Mr. Supratim Dey, Manager (LCC), and other officers from CESC. Sewing machines and beauty kits were distributed among the girls who took training in Tailoring, Beauty and Wellness. Certificates were awarded to all the students during the programme in the presence of parents, guardians, and community members. 68% of the 300 students have already been successfully placed.

Story of Change

Muktangan

Nisha Roy, residing in Ward No. 8 of Pujali Municipality, faced an educational setback when she could not pass her Madhyamik Examination the previous year. Her family, grappling with significant financial challenges, felt compelled to discontinue her education. Nisha's father worked as a van puller, and her mother earned a living as a domestic help. In their absence, Nisha took on the responsibilities of managing their household and completing all domestic tasks.

Upon engagement with Muktangan Project team, Nisha's situation came to light. The team initiated discussions with her parents, urging them to reconsider and permit Nisha to continue her education. They provided a glimmer of hope by introducing the concept of free academic support available at the Muktangan Centre, a CSR initiative of CESC Ltd. The team successfully convinced Nisha's parents to allow her to resume her studies, taking care of all necessary paperwork. As a result, Nisha was re-enrolled at Kalipur Girls' School, where she had previously dropped out. She now attends the Centre regularly and is determined to retake her Madhyamik Examination with newfound enthusiasm.
