#### World Breast Feeding Week observed under SNEH Project

On August 7, 2024, the World Breastfeeding Week was observed at Topsia Sporting Federation under SNEH project. The event saw participation from 113 individuals, including pregnant women, lactating mothers, male family members, ICDS representatives, UPHC (Ward No. 66) staff, and local club members. The objective was to educate on the benefits of breastfeeding for both infants and mothers and to advocate for increased breastfeeding support in workplaces. Medical experts from the Urban Primary Health Centre (UPHC) and Institute of Child Health (ICH) highlighted the significance of colostrum, proper breastfeeding techniques, and the importance of exclusive breastfeeding for the first six months. Participants also received guidance on introducing semisolid foods after six months.

## Sankalp – CESC Limited's CSR initiative for Sustainable Student Empowerment

Launched in August 2024, Sankalp, a CSR initiative of CESC, aims to empower students as environmental change-makers through sustainable practices. The initiative targets around 3,000 students from 150 schools, focusing on climate change, waste management, plasticfree environments, gardening, and power safety. By educating students on these crucial topics, Sankalp seeks to combat environmental degradation and promote community empowerment and ecological restoration. The project envisions transforming schools into models of sustainable living. So far, it has reached approximately 1,511 students across 20 schools, marking the beginning of a broader impact.

# Aparajita - Addressing Floral Waste: A Sustainable Solution for North Dum Dum

Floral waste, prevalent in India due to religious practices, poses significant environmental challenges, comprising nearly a third of the nation's solid waste. In North Dum Dum Municipality, with 56 Hindu temples, 6 mosques, and 67,484 families, about 1.2 tonnes of floral waste are generated daily. This waste clogs water channels and contaminates ecosystems.

To tackle this, CESC, in partnership with Child in Need Institute (CINI) and North Dum Dum Municipality, launched a Scientific Floral Waste Management initiative. The project converts waste into organic powder and biofertilizers through meticulous sorting and processing by trained Self-Help Group (SHG) members. This approach reduces pollution, empowers women, and fosters community engagement, ensuring long-term environmental and economic benefits.



A Felicitation Programme was organised on 22<sup>nd</sup> August, 2024 at Kolkata Municipal Corporation Auditorium, Garden Reach, for local youths who successfully completed skill training under Eklavya - CESC Skill Academy Project, a CSR initiative of CESC. During the period 2023-24, 150 participants were trained in Basic Computer skills with Advanced Excel and Customer Relationship Management (CRM) domains in Garden Reach Centre. The event was graced by Shri Firhad Hakim, the Hon'ble Mayor of Kolkata; Mr. Subir Verma, Executive Director and CHRO, CESC Ltd; Mr. Soumitra Ghosh, Sr. VP (Distributions Services); Dr. Neepa Saha Sharma, GM (CSR); Mr. Anirban Raha, GM (Planning); Mr. Shams Iqbal, Councilor of Ward No. 134; and other senior officers from CESC. Certificates were awarded to the trainees in the presence of their parents, guardians, and community members. Notably, 65% of the graduates have secured employment, with the highest salary offered being Rs. 14,000.
