Report on the Ind AS Financial Statements

# Significant accounting policies and notes to the accounts - For financial year ended 31 March 2018

### 1 Corporate information

Nalanda Power Company Limited ("the Company") is a limited company incorporated and domiciled in India. Its registered office is located at 6 Church Lane, 1st floor, Kolkata -700 001, India.

The company is exploring future business opportunities in order to imporve the Company's financial health.

# 2 <u>Significant accounting policies, judgements and estimates</u> Basis of preparation of financial statements

### 2.1 Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared to comply in all material aspects with Indian Accounting Standards ("Ind AS") notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 and other provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 to the extent applicable.

For all the periods upto and including quarter and the year ended March 31, 2016, the financial statements were prepared in accordance with the accounting standards notified under the Companies (Accounting Standard) Rules, 2006 (as amended) and other relevant provisions of the Act.

The financial statements are presented in Indian rupees.

### 2.2 Basis of Measurement

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost convention.

### 2.3 Use of estimate

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Ind AS requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on a periodic basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimates are revised and in any future periods affected.

### 3 Summary of significant accounting policies

A financial instrument is a contract that gives rise to a financial asset of one entity and a financial liability or equity of another entity.

### 3.1 Financial asset

### i) Initial measurement

All financial assets are recognised initially at fair value. Transaction costs that are attributable to the acquisition of the financial asset (other than financial assets recorded at fair value through profit or loss) are included in the fair value of the financial assets.

## ii) Classification and subsequent measurement

For the purpose of subsequent measurement, financial assets of the Company are classified in the following categories:

- 1) financial assets measured at amortised cost
- 2) financial assets measured at fair value through other comprehensive income
- 3) financial assets measured at fair value through profit and loss and

The classification of financial assets depends on the objective of the business model. Management determines the classification of its financial assets at initial recognition.

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### 3.2 Financial liability

### i) Initial measurement

All financial liabilities are recognised initially at fair value net of directly attributable transaction cost appropriate pany's financial liabilities include other payables.

### ii) Classification and subsequent measurement

For the purpose of subsequent measurement, financial instruments of the Company are classified in the following categories:

- 1) financial liabilities measured at amortised cost
- 2) financial liabilities measured at fair value through profit and loss

### Financial liabilities at amortised cost:

Financial liabilities at amortised cost represented by trade and other payables are initially recognized at fair value, and subsequently carried at amortized cost using the effective interest method.

## 16 FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVE AND POLICIES
